A Brief about North 24 Parganas District

The North 24-Parganas district is made up of five subdivisions: Barasat, Barrackpore, Bongaon, Bashirhat, and Bidhannagar. Barasat serves as the district's administrative centre. The district is bordered to the north by Nadia district, to the south by South 24-Parganas, to the east by Bangladesh, and to the west by Kolkata, the Hooghly district, and the Hooghly River.

The district of North 24-Parganas shares an approximately 230-kilometer eastern international boundary with Bangladesh. With an area of 4034 square kilometres and a population of 8934286 according to the 2001 Census, the district has the greatest density of any district in the state, with 2182 people per square kilometre. The district is located between latitudes 23°15'2" N and 22°11'6" N and east latitudes 98°5' E and 88°20' E longitude.

The backbone of North 24 Parganas' economy is agriculture. The primary occupations of people include farming, fishing, and other agricultural pursuits. Agricultural landholdings are typically around 3.2 Bighas in size. Although North 24 Parganas is one of West Bengal's most economically developed districts, the southern part of the district—the Sundarbans area—has persistent poverty.

Jute, coconuts, potatoes, wheat, and rapeseed are the main crops grown in this district. One of the essential components for the efficient expansion of agriculture is fertiliser, which is provided by the district government. A portion of North 24 Parganas's populace makes their living in the industrial sector. This district is home to Kolkata's hub for information technology.

Programme Inauguration and Conduction

The event was inauguarated and presided over by Shri Chandranath Sinha, Minister-in-Charge, MSME & Textiles Department, Govt. of West Bengal.

The event saw the presence of Sri Sobhandeb Chattopadhyay, Minister-in-Charge for Agriculture, Govt. of West Bengal; Sri Rathin Ghosh, Minister-in-Charge for Food and Supplies, Govt. of West Bengal; Janab Tajmul Hossain, Minister-of-State, MSME & Textiles and Minority Affairs & Madrasa Education; Smt. Chandrima Bhattacharya, Minister of State for Finance (Independent Charge), Health and Family Welfare, Land and Land Reforms, Refugee and Rehabilitation of the Govt. of West Bengal; Shri Rajesh Pandey, IAS, Principal Secretary, MSME and Textiles; Shri Sharad Kumar Dwivedi, IAS, District Magistrate of North 24 Parganas, Sri Tapas Chatterjee, MLA of Rajarhat Newtown, and other key dignitaries.

Following the registration process which started at 10 AM, the programme began at around 11 AM. After the inauguration session, the selected entrepreneurs of North 24 Parganas district were handed over the certificates, statutory clearances or approvals, bank sanctions etc.

The programme was then followed by the presentation session where Ms. Ritwika Chakraborty, EFC Associate of the State Export Facilitation Centre (SEFC), gave a brief presentation on the export awareness, export trend of West Bengal, the objectives of SEFC and also quickly touched upon the export procedures. Post presentation, she requested the entrepreneurs to contact the export helpdesk for any export related queries.

At around 1:30 PM, the interactive session began with the Principal Secretary, MSME & Textiles Department making the entrepreneurs aware of the Departmental schemes and programmes for promotion of MSMEs focusing on Bhabishyat Credit Card Scheme, Banglashree Scheme, Modified Textile Incentive Scheme, SAIP Scheme and the newly launched Scheme for financial assistance to the artisans.

He appealed to the entrepreneurs to avail themselves of the benefits of the schemes. EoDB Cell made the entrepreneurs aware of the various regulatory reforms undertaken by the state government to ensure an enabling business environment in the state through power point presentations. The entrepreneurs directly interacted with the officials, raised their queries, and sought clarification and assistance to resolve their issues in setting up new enterprises and expanding existing enterprises. The concerned officials answered all the queries properly and highlighted how the issues would be addressed. However, in some cases of local problems, the Principal Secretary of the MSME and Textile Department instructed the concerned district authorities to resolve the issues within a specific time frame.

The programme came to a close at 2:30 PM. Entrepreneurs from different areas of North 24 Parganas took part in the event. More than 20 help desks, set up by the major departments, remained functional till 4 PM. The entrepreneurs visited these help desks to receive clarification and assistance about their problems.
