# FASII ER (FEDERATION OF ASSOCIATION OF SMALL INDUSTRIES OF INDIA) – EASTERN REGION

#### INTRODUCTION

FASII ER (FEDERATION OF ASSOCIATION OF SMALL INDUSTRIES OF INDIA) – EASTERN REGION was born after the visit of the Ford Foundation Team to India in 1953 which emphasized the need for a national apex body for micro, small, village, cottage and rural industries.

FASII was ushered into existence in the year 1959 under the sponsorship of the Government of India and at the instance of Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru and Shri Manubai Shah, Former Union Industries Minister. Padamshree Late A.R. Bhat, a Gandhian, was instrumental in the very edifice of FASII. FASII Building was inaugurated by Late Dr. S. Radhakrishnan in the year 1963.

The Federation comprises, predominantly, associations of micro and small enterprises as members with their membership ranging from a few hundreds to thousands. The entire spectrum of micro and small enterprises - spinning, chemicals, plastics, agro, food-processing, textile, engineering, electronics, electricals, handlooms, handicrafts, etc. - is covered by FASII. A good number of individual members also occupy the rolls of FASII Membership.

#### PROGRAM INAUGURATION & CONDUCTION

Mr. Debdutta Bandopadhyay, Regional Hony. Jt. Secretary, of FASII, gave a brief address to open the session. He extended a warm welcome to everyone in attendance, including Dr. K. Rangarajan (Head, IIFT Kolkata), Ms. Sumana Das (EFC Co-ordinator), IDO Domjur, Marketing Manager (DIC Howrah Office), as well as the participants.

Dr. K. Rangarajan emphasized on the Promotional, Policy & Development of Export of Product & Services. He stated the importance of having an own identity of the organization so as to participate in the foreign trade, as well as avail the benefits of the different Govt. schemes and incentives for exports.

Dr. K. Rangarajan, IIFT, Kolkata Chapter Head has elaborately described the need of Product Selection and product specification and the needed quality that varies from Country to Country.

He emphasized on the research of one's product in the foreign market – about the products demand & the quality aspect of the product that the overseas people look forward to citing an example of the liking of Japanese men in terms of formal footwear's i.e. Japanese people like leather shoes with a heel.

He also suggested that the demand of a particular product depends on the food habit, sociocultural aspects & the climatic conditions prevailing in that particular country. Accordingly the product needs to be modified.

Also he emphasized on the pricing of one's product in the foreign market & importance of product differentiation.

He also informed about the new initiative taken by the Government to boost the export in the form of delivery up to 35 KGS by India Post to the worldwide buyers.

Ms. Sumana Das, EFC Co ordinator has deliberated on IEC registration and other formalities for Export. Ms. Sumana Das then briefed them about the EFC Portal:

- How to register in the EFC Portal & also raise query
- The Step by Step Process to Export
- District Wise Potential Product & Markets
- Tariff & Non-Tariff Barriers
- Certification Agencies
- Upcoming Research on District & Country Profiles

Following the event, there was a networking session which included conversation between the attendees and the in-person Interns of EFC.
